# DRUG CARDS DAILY

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#### Name(s)

- Generic: hydrocodone / acetaminophen (hye droe KOE done / a seet a MIN oh fen)
- Brand: Norco, Vicodin, Lorcet, Lortab (elixir), Xodol

#### **Therapeutic Category**

Opioid + Analgesic

#### Indication(s)

- 1. Pain management, pain relief: For severe pain that requires the use of an opioid after alternatives have been exhausted.
- 2. Acute pain: 3-7 days of treatment using the lowest effective dose.
- 3. Chronic pain: Used secondary to non-pharmacologic and non-opioid treatments.

#### Dosage Form / Strength / Dosing

- Dosage Forms: Tablet, Solution, Elixir
  - o Tablet: hydrocodone/APAP (mg) 5/325, 7.5/325, 10/325, 5/300, 7.5/300, 10/300, \*2.5/325 (\*less common)
  - o **Solution:** hydrocodone/APAP (mg/ml) 7.5/325 /15 ml, 10/325 /15 ml
  - Elixir: hydrocodone/APAP (mg/ml) 10/300 /15 ml (\*7% ethanol)
- Dosing: Adult & Geriatric
  - o Individualized dosing.
  - Start low and titrate to dose based on analgesic response with minimal adverse effects.
  - o Generally every 4-6 hour dosing as needed; Max dose limited by APAP ≤ 4g/day
  - Gradually taper patient's dose down if chronic use treatment is to end
- Dosing: Pediatric
  - o Titrate to appropriate analgesic response; ≤ 75 mg/kg/day
  - Max 5 daily doses; APAP ≤ 4g/day

#### Mechanism of Action & Pharmacology

- Hydrocodone: Pain perception altered through binding to opiate receptors located in the central nervous system (CNS). Overall CNS
  depressant.
  - Excreted in urine (26% of initial dose in 72 hours)
  - o Peak serum in about 1 hour | Half-Life around 4 hours
- Acetaminophen: Speculated activation of the descending serotonergic inhibitory pathways in CNS and inhibition of hypothalamic heatregulating center.

#### **Side Effects**

CNS depression, constipation, hypotension

#### **Drug Interactions**

- CNS Depressants and drugs that affect the CNS: alcohol, benzodiazepines, amphetamines, anticholinergics
- CYP2D6, CYP3A4 metabolized drugs (inhibitors, inducers)

#### **Monitoring Parameters**

- Black Box Warning: Addiction/abuse/misuse, hepatotoxicity
- Level of pain relief; Respiratory status; Metal status; Blood pressure; Bowel function

#### Patient Counseling Information

Drug used to ease pain; Common: Nausea, vomiting, headache, heartburn, dizziness, passing out, clammy skin

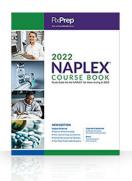
